To encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular to encourage and foster:

FIRST: the development of acquaintances as an opportunity for service;

SECOND: high ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD: the application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH: the advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

Five Avenues of Rotary Service

Club Service: Focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the effective functioning of the club.

Vocational Service: Encourages Rotarians to serve others through their vocations and to practice high ethical standards.

Community Service: Covers the projects and activities the club undertakes to improve life in its community.

International Service: Encompasses actions taken to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe and to promote world understanding and peace.

Youth Service: Recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development

The O'Fallon Rotary Club

The O'Fallon Rotary Club was chartered on May 19, 1925, with 15 members. Today, the O'Fallon Rotary Club has about 85 members and has sponsored the formation of Rotary Clubs in Lebanon, Waterloo, Columbia, Fairview Heights, as well as the O'Fallon Sunrise Club. The Club participates in a variety of community and international service projects each year including:

Adopt-A-Highway — twice a year members clean up Highway 50

City Parades — hosts annual Children's Parade and enters floats in the Veterans' Day and Christmas parades.

Salvation Army — rings bells to raise money for the Salvation Army

Salute to Scott — members run the welcome booth at the annual picnic

Rotary Youth Exchange — annually host H.S. students from various foreign countries

Student of the Month — sponsors an OTHS student each month during the school year

Scholarships — awards two \$1,000 scholarships to graduating students

Mentoring — members and spouses mentor students at local grade schools

Red Cross Blood Drive — members donate blood and sponsor a blood drive twice per year

Adopt-a-Family — members adopt a deserving family each year at Christmas

Polio Eradication — supports Rotary International efforts to eradicate polio from the face of the earth.

What is Rotary

Rotary is an organization of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build good will and peace in the world.

Rotary is the world's first service club. The first Rotary Club was founded in Chicago, IL on February 23, 1905 by a lawyer, Paul Harris, and three of his friends. Weekly meetings were "rotated" among the founders' offices.

Rotary is some 1.2 million service-minded men and women belonging to over 31,000 Rotary clubs in 168 nations around the world.

Rotarians meet weekly for fellowship and interesting programs dealing with topics of local and global importance. Membership is by invitation and reflects a wide cross-section of community representation.

Rotarians plan and carry out a remarkable variety of humanitarian, educational, and cultural exchange programs that touch people's lives in their local communities and our world.

Rotary is the Rotary Foundation, that each year provides some \$90 million for international, scholarships, cultural exchanges, and humanitarian projects—large and small—that improve the quality of life for millions of people.

Membership Responsibilities

Each member of the Club is expected to attend regular weekly meetings and is required to attend 60% of meetings each quarter. Members can attend or make up meetings at any Rotary Club in the world. Each member is required to pay annual dues and expected to support Club activities and projects.
